Capital Dames: The Civil War and the Women of Washington

Once again this year we are partnering with the Des Plaines Public Library to present a program of outstanding quality. Jenny Riddle, book reviewer and dramatist, will present *Capital Dames: The Civil War and the Women of Washington*, by Cokie Roberts. You will learn some remarkable things about the women behind the men who were leaders of both the Union and the Confederacy. These were not shy, retiring ladies who took tea in their parlors; they may not have been elected, but they wielded a great deal of power. While she is known as a “book reviewer,” Jenny Riddle does not *review* a book – she lives it as she personifies the characters in appropriate costume!
