SEPTEMBER!

For our September meeting, we are joining with the Park Ridge League of Women Voters to present a program on the Independent Maps initiative. It will be held on <u>Wednesday</u>, <u>September 16th, 7:00 p.m., at the Park Ridge Public Library</u>. The speaker is Christopher Butler, Illinois Field Director for Independent Maps.

Independent Maps is collecting signatures to get a Constitutional Amendment on the November, 2016 ballot to have Illinois' political maps redistricted by an independent body rather than the political party in power. Redistricting, which is done every ten years, has caused many races to go uncontested due to districts being drawn unfavorably towards the opposing party. Cities have been divided during the process and current legislators have been drawn out of their districts, requiring them to move in order to run to retain their seats.

We are inviting the public to attend this meeting, and hope that not only will you attend but that you will invite your friends and neighbors. This is something that affects all of us in Illinois! We are deviating from our usual Thursday meeting night, but the library is unavailable on Thursdays because of their scheduled programs. Because this is such a timely and important topic, we felt that it would be worth changing our date.

The Park Ridge Public Library is located at 20 S. Prospect in Park Ridge, at the intersection of Touhy, Northwest Highway and Prospect in downtown Park Ridge (across the street from the Pickwick Theater). There is a large city parking lot just south of the library building. It can be entered from either Prospect Ave. or Summit St.
