Congratulations and Thank You!

Throughout the year, members and supporters of AAUW of Illinois sent countless messages to our legislators, urging their action to improve access to health care for women in Illinois. Once the legislature took action, we turned our attention to the governor's office to help ensure enactment of this crucial legislation.

Thanks to your advocacy, two important bills have now become law in Illinois!

On July 29, Governor Rauner signed into law SB 1564, an amendment to the Health Care Right of Conscience Act, and HB 5576, the Illinois Contraceptive Coverage Act. Both of these bills will make sure that women in our state will get the health care That they need without encountering unnecessary barriers.

These laws are a huge victory for women in Illinois – and on behalf of AAUW of Illinois, Congratulations and thanks for your advocacy!
