Saturday, June 13th Did you know that there is a gallery in Schaumburg that features Native American art? The gallery is owned and operated by Native Americans, and is the only one of its kind in Illinois. The name of the gallery, *Trickster,* designates a spiritual "cultural educator" who teaches life principles. Through its displays and other cultural events, the gallery wishes to teach the impact that art has had in shaping our mutual cultures by exhibiting art from both Native American and other American cultures.

We will gather at the gallery at 10:00 a.m. and tour the exhibits. The cost is \$5.00 per person, payable at the gallery. After the tour, we hope that many, if not all, of those attending will want to have lunch together at a nearby restaurant (and there are *many* in the area) and socialize for a while. This would be a wonderful opportunity to invite friends to join you to get to know about our branch and get acquainted with some of our members. (If we hope to gain members, we have to be ambassadors for our branch.)

The gallery is located at 190 S. Roselle Rd. in Schaumburg. It is just south of Schaumburg Rd., so if you go to Schaumburg via Golf Rd. or Higgins Rd., you should turn south on Roselle Rd. to Schaumburg Rd. The gallery is just south of the intersection.

OUR ANNUAL MEETING

Our annual meeting was held on Thursday, May 21 at the Des Plaines Elks Club. After dinner, the members discussed a number of items: election of officers, our contributions, plans for next year, fundraising, communication, etc. Because we have had no real fundraising activities, we are using our savings to fund our contributions, which is fine because the money was raised earlier through our fundraising efforts. We contributed \$750 to Oakton Community College to fund the Northwest Suburban Branch Scholarship, given to a woman returning to school to complete her education; we gave \$500 to the Eleanor Roosevelt Fund of AAUW, which supports research on issues that are important to women and girls. We also decided to set aside \$250 to help fund the Tech Savvy event to be held at Oakton next spring. Our branch will be one of the assisting branches for this project.

Merna Folkers was reelected as Program Vice-president and Irene Jinks as Treasurer.

There was some discussion about times for meetings, and this is a difficult problem. Many of our members do not like evening meetings, but Saturday meetings are also difficult for many. For next year, we will plan a combination of times, with evening meetings being held during fall and spring. We are hoping to be able to partner with the Des Plaines Library again this year, opening the meeting to the public. It might also be possible for us to partner with other groups to provide interesting programs. Meeting times, of course, have an effect on attendance, but it was also suggested that perhaps we should have reminder calls a day or two before each meeting.

We were delighted to have a special guest – Elaine Fisher who was a member of our branch for many years before she moved to Naperville. Elaine has rejoined our branch as a dual member, so we hope to see her occasionally during the next year!

TECH SAVVY 2016

The Jane Adams Branch is planning for their 3rd Tech Savvy conference to be held on April 16, 2016 at Oakton Community College. The one-day event is for girls from 6-9th grade.
