# With WINGS We Can Fly!

In 1985, a program began in the northwest suburbs that has evolved into one of the largest domestic violence service and household providers in the state of Illinois – WINGS: Women in Need Growing Stronger. Single women with children are able to receive temporary safe shelter through WINGS housing. Staff provides one-on-one, individualized assistance that allows women to set personal goals that will enable them to work, continue their education, and care for themselves and their children.

On Saturday morning, November 12, we will have a speaker from WINGS at our branch meeting at the Des Plaines Library who will tell us about WINGS, what they do and how they accomplish all that they do. The program has expanded greatly since it began and is considered a model for others. Perhaps you are already familiar with the resale shops that the group operates, one in Niles and one in Palatine. The Niles shop, which is closer to us, is located on Golf Road just a couple of blocks east of Milwaukee Ave. It stocks everything from clothing, often new items, to household goods to furniture. All is clean and attractively displayed. If you have never been there, it is worth a visit! WINGS also has a "wish list" of items that they can use in their various programs; the list is included in this newsletter, and we will be asking you to bring contributions to our December social.

Plan to attend our meeting and invite your friends and neighbors to join you. Since this is a program helping so many women and children, we want to do all that we can to help publicize it. Since the meeting will be over at about noon, perhaps some of us can get together for lunch.
