A SAD NOTE

We have heard that former branch member Mary Carlson died on September 11. Mary was a long-time AAUW member. She served as president of this branch from 1963-1965 and became active in the state organization, where she also served as president. Before Mary's husband, Elmer, died, they funded the Mary Jordan Carlson Award on the national level; it is to assist a woman doing graduate work in the field of nutrition, the field in which Mary spent her working years. She was the author of several cookbooks, and was an early advocate of microwave cooking. We remember the many branch socials that Mary hosted in her home, and for which she prepared much of the food. After Elmer's death, Mary moved to Lawrence, Kansas, to be nearer to family and for several years enjoyed traveling with them and participating in the many activities at the retirement facility where she lived. Mary would have been ninety-one years old in December.
