#### FROM OUR PRESIDENT

Did you know AAUW is committing to train 10,000,000 women – that's TEN MILLION – on salary negotiations? Salary negotiation is something women do not generally feel comfortable doing. And because salary history usually affects the amount of money offered at the next job, the effect of not negotiating even one salary compounds as a career goes on. AAUW's research shows that one year out of college there is a 7% wage gap

between women and men with college degrees that was unexplainable even after accounting for many variables, and as years progress the differential becomes even greater. That is why, on April 13 at 1:30 p.m., our branch is hosting a *Work Smart Salary Negotiation* workshop for 40 women at the Des Plaines library. (Men can come but it is geared at women.)

#### Paycheck Fairness Act Advances in House of Representatives

On Tuesday, February 26, the House Education and Labor Committee <u>approved</u> the Paycheck Fairness Act. The committee approved one amendment with minor and technical changes and defeated several harmful amendments that would have undermined the goals of the legislation. The Paycheck Fairness Act remains strong and now advances to the House floor, where the full House of Representatives will vote on its passage. AAUW advocates ensured that Congress made this critical pay equity legislation a top priority, and we continue to <u>advocate</u> for swift passage of the Paycheck Fairness Act to help close the gender pay gap.
