I'm pleased that women's voices saved our rights in many places across the U.S. In Illinois, we elected Pro-choice women to the Illinois Supreme Court; that should protect our reproductive and healthcare rights for years to come. Voting rights seem secure in most states, which gives us some hope for the future presidential election.

On Nov. 12, the Chicago branch invited us to join them to hear from three recipients of **AAUW Fellowships and Grants**. It was very interesting to hear about the impact of AAUW on their lives. If you missed it, the program was recorded and will be posted to the Jane Addams branch web site. Don't forget the book discussion of **Madam Secretary** on Nov. 29th.

In **December**, we plan to focus on the holidays, and share crafts, decorations, and family traditions. Alice Jenks is an expert crafter and has a variety of items to show and share. However, we would like everyone to share something related to the holiday season. This sharing will help us get more acquainted. We will meet on Zoom so you will be able to share your craft or decoration with us all. Remember that women need 8 or 10 people to urge them to run before they do it. In these times of book bans and attacks on health and history curriculum, we need strong people on school boards to support teachers and children's complete and honest education.

Thanksgiving is just around the corner, and I want to say **Thank you** to everyone for supporting AAUW policy issues, whether it is by serving as a branch officer, voting, advocating for our issues, or just being a member, which supports our AAUW research and legislative monitoring/lobbying.
